

Good King Wenceslas

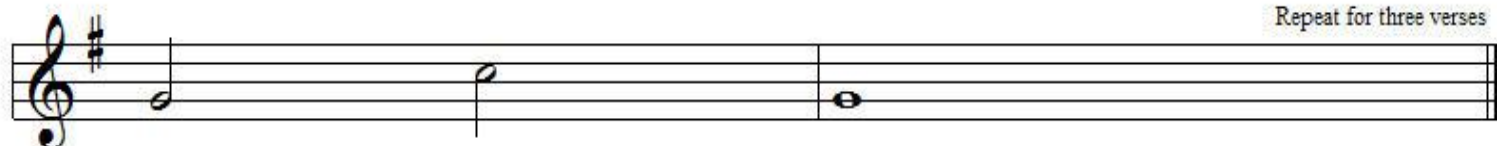
